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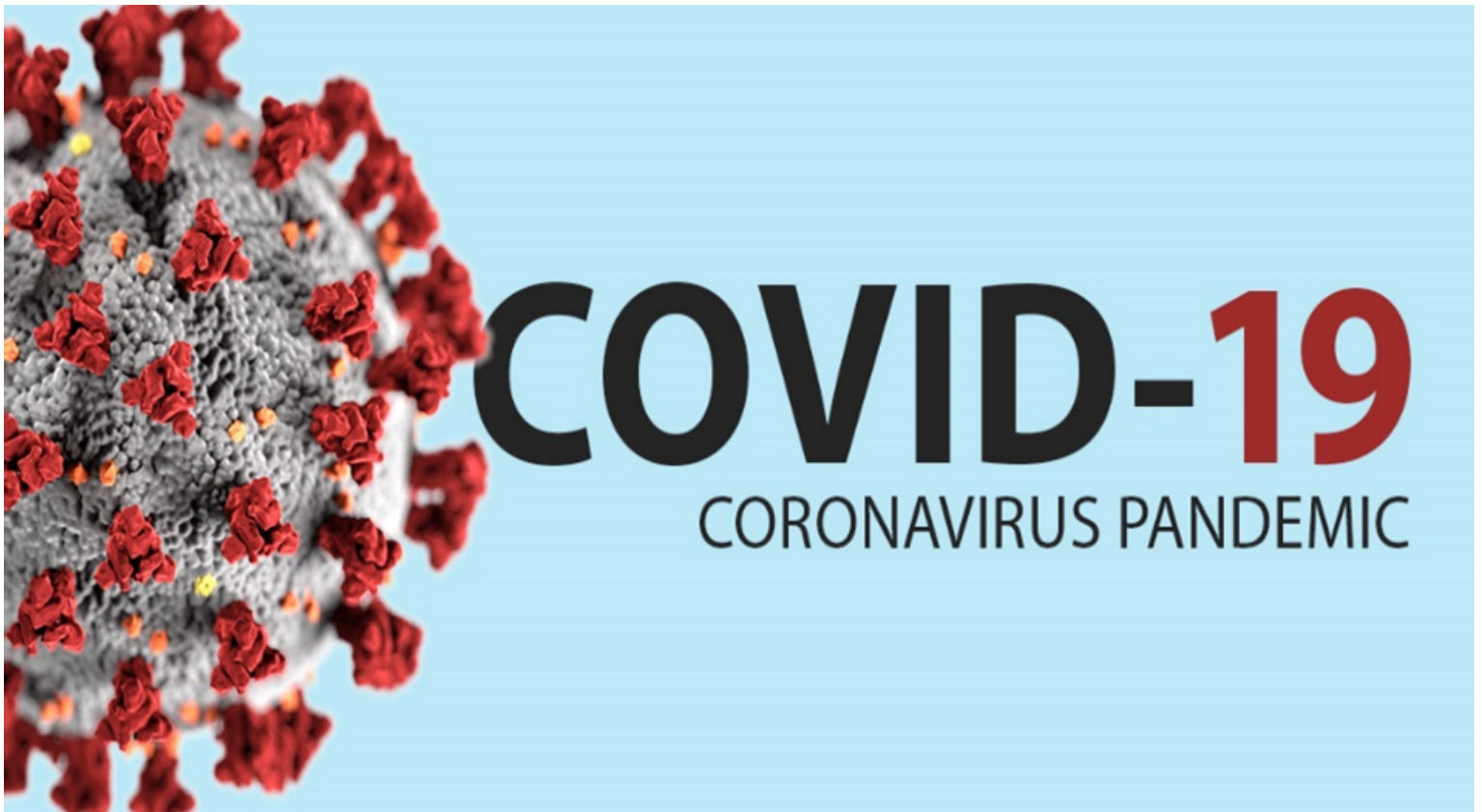
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I. Background and Purpose

Background

To support COVID-19 response initiatives, the New Jersey Department of Health received federal funding for state fiscal year 2022 (7/1/21-6/30/22) that was awarded to county and local health departments to support COVID-19 response. Subsequently, the Morris County Division of Public Health established the role of the Social Support Coordinator to assist Morris County residents exposed to COVID-19 with needs such as housing, food, mental health and other support services, and help with outreach to vulnerable populations.

Purpose

The information and data presented herein defines those residents living in Morris County who are at high-risk for contracting COVID-19 and informs the development of a community resource manual for the Morris County Division of Public Health. The purpose of this manual is to be a resource for social service providers, healthcare providers, and local health departments who are providing targeted outreach to COVID-exposed and COVID-positive residents within Morris County. At the time of writing, the data and information provided was current to the best of my knowledge.

III. The Impact of COVID-19 on Morris County

Beyond the COVID-19 illness, the pandemic has led to a wide variety of secondary effects: increases in depression and anxiety; economic fragility; employment, educational, and social disruption; barriers to work (i.e. childcare, health issues, sick days); and an increase in substance use.

1. ECONOMIC HARDSHIPS

The COVID-19 pandemic created a concurrent health and economic crisis that undoubtedly affected all households in some way and has increased the hardships for those who were already struggling to make ends meet prior to the pandemic.

The table below compares poverty levels across the United States, New Jersey, and Morris County.

While the poverty level in Morris County is much less than the overall percentage of New Jerseyans and significantly lower than the nation, there is a substantial number of residents (4.8%) living in poverty who are at increased vulnerability to experiencing negative consequences from COVID-19.

Households that live just above the poverty line are also at greater risk of experiencing economic hardship but are ineligible to receive public assistance due to just barely exceeding income level requirements. They are referred to as A.L.I.C.E., or Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed Households.

A.L.I.C.E.

United for A.L.I.C.E. What is it and why is it important?

Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed

ALICE represents the growing number of individuals and families that earn above the Federal Poverty Level (FPL), but do not make enough to afford the basics of housing, childcare, food, transportation, healthcare, and technology. Families are forced to prioritize what bills will be paid and which ones will go unpaid. Often having to make choices between not seeking medical attention when needed, not paying for quality childcare and education for their children, or not paying the rent. One unexpected expense, like contracting a serious illness or having their car breakdown, can push this population into financial crisis.

Below is information about those households that live just above the federal poverty level, but the cost of household essentials outpaces their wages. The ALICE Threshold represents the minimum income level necessary for survival for a household in each county in each state.

2. MENTAL HEALTH AND SUBSTANCE USE

Mental Health

Mental health conditions have been exacerbated by the COVID-19 pandemic and without significant and transformative action, the impact of the pandemic on mental health and wellbeing will be felt for years to come.

Adult Mental Health

More than one in ten adults in the U.S. have reported symptoms of anxiety or depression since May 2020, in comparison to one in ten adults in 2019.

Children's mental health

Children have experienced major disruptions since the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic due to school closures, remote learning, and social isolation. Loneliness and isolation are known risk factors for poor mental health.

Substance Use

COVID-19 has intensified the troubling long-term trends for alcohol and drug related use and deaths.

Drug Overdose Deaths

In the United States from 2019 to 2020, the rate of drug overdose deaths increased 31% for all sex, age, race and Hispanic origin groups, the highest one-year increase ever recorded.

Alcohol Related Deaths

In the United States from 2019 to 2020, the rate of alcohol related deaths increased 27% for all groups, except for ages 0 to 17. Provisional data from 2021 show the numbers have continued to increase, up 34% from pre-pandemic levels.

Barriers to mental health and substance use treatment in Morris County

- Staffing shortages and lack of mental health professionals
- Treatment programs are at capacity
- Financial barriers: Uninsured and under-insured individuals
- Social stigma of mental health conditions
- Lack of mental health education and awareness

3. LGBTQ+

Most of the data that exists on COVID-19 has not included sexual orientation and gender identity, but the data we do have on the pandemic's impact on the LGBTQ+ community confirms what we anecdotally knew to be true. Across all social indicators wherein LGBTQ+ people were already impacted by inequities; health, healthcare, housing, employment, child and family care, and more, the data indicates COVID-19 has only compounded them.

The table below demonstrates some of the hardships the LGBTQ+ community is experiencing since the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic.

LGBTQ+ Teens

While trying to deal with the challenges of being a teenager, LGBT teens also have to deal with harassment and threats on a regular basis. LGBT youth are nearly twice as likely to be called names, verbally harassed or physically assaulted at school compared to non-LGBT peers. Their mental and physical health and their educations are at-risk.

4. SENIORS

Older adults have been especially impacted by the coronavirus pandemic, as they are at higher risk of serious illness if infected and account for the largest percentages of COVID-related deaths, especially if they are immunocompromised.

For instance, as of June 21, 2022, of those that have died from COVID-19 in NJ

- 11,363 individuals were between the ages of 65-74 (33.47%)
- 15,285 individuals were 80+ years old (45.02%)

Even before the pandemic older adults were at higher risk of loneliness (associated with anxiety, anger and emotional instability) and social isolation (associated with decreased quality of life and increased mortality). The lockdown has only exacerbated these conditions.

5. HOMELESSNESS

The homeless are considered one of the most vulnerable groups for high risk of contracting COVID-19 due to the inability to self-isolate, poor access to handwashing and hygiene, lack of access to masks, poor nutrition, and poor health.

Interestingly, a population surveyed in 2021 by Monarch Housing found more households attributed their homelessness to loss or reduction of job income (17.9%). Only 8% reported their homelessness was a direct result of COVID-19.

There is a strong correlation between poverty and homelessness. In comparing the racial breakdown of those experiencing homelessness to the general population and those living in poverty, disparate impacts along racial lines are evident.

- Difficulty paying bills; including rent and utility bills
- Mental health and substance use issues
